

## Overview over tenses; active vs. passive

Tense	Active	Passive --> <b>past participle</b>
<b>Present (simple)</b>	He <b>makes</b> chocolate.	Chocolate <b>is made</b> (by him).
<b>Present continuous</b>	He <b>is making</b> chocolate.	Chocolate <b>is being made</b> (by him).
<b>Present perfect (simple)</b>	He <b>has made</b> chocolate.	Chocolate <b>has been made</b> (by him).
<b>Present perfect continuous</b>	He <b>has been making</b> chocolate.	Chocolate <b>has been being made</b> (by him).
<b>Past (simple)</b>	He <b>made</b> chocolate.	Chocolate <b>was made</b> (by him).
<b>Past continuous</b>	He <b>was making</b> chocolate.	Chocolate <b>was being made</b> (by him).
<b>Past perfect (simple)</b>	He <b>had made</b> chocolate.	Chocolate <b>had been made</b> (by him).
<b>Past perfect continuous</b>	He <b>had been making</b> chocolate.	Chocolate <b>had been being made</b> (by him).
<b>Will-future (simple)</b>	He <b>will make</b> chocolate.	Chocolate <b>will be made</b> (by him).
<b>Will-future continuous</b>	He <b>will be making</b> chocolate.	Chocolate <b>will be being made</b> (by him).
<b>Going to-future (simple)</b>	He <b>is going to make</b> chocolate.	Chocolate <b>is going to be made</b> (by him).
<b>Going to-future continuous</b>	He <b>is going to be making</b> chocolate.	Chocolate <b>is going to be being made</b> (by him).
